## Conditions of Entry

- **Entry Fees \$1 per exhibit for all general exhibits; 50c per exhibit for kids exhibits.**
- Certificates will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in each **class** and will have points counted towards sub-section prize money and overall section trophies. (judges may withhold awarding any prizes if there is insufficient competition or quality in a class)
- Prize money is \$5 for 1<sup>st</sup> prize, \$2 for second prize per **sub-section**.

- Exhibit Entries must be collected between 5pm and 6pm **on Show day**. Exhibition staff will not be responsible for Exhibits after 5pm. If necessary, Exhibits can be collected on Sunday 17th March between 9.00am and 10.00am however Exhibits left overnight are done so at the Exhibitors own risk. Any Exhibit not collected by Sunday 10am will be discarded (unless arranged with Exhibition Coordinator).



# Section 1 Arts and Crafts

## ***Subsection A – Knitting Yarn Work Needlework and Dolls/Teddies***

### Entry Requirements

All Exhibits MUST be the work of the Exhibitor

All Exhibits must be new, and not previously entered at a show.

Articles MUST NOT be stitched to mounts

Every Exhibit MUST have a removable label affixed with Section Class & Exhibitor's name.

Hand-knitted only, no machine knitted articles.

### **Class—KNITTING**

1. Knitted babies blanket
2. Knitted baby item
3. Creative knitting—any article
4. Knitted scarf, hat or beanie
5. Knitted knee rug or Afghan
6. Knitted adult shawl
7. Knitted doll or toy
8. Knitted baby matinee set 3 pieces

### **Class—DOLLS & TEDDIES**

10. Mythical doll or animal
11. Doll made entirely of cloth
12. Stuffed toy or animal made from felt or fur fabric

All Exhibits MUST be the work of the Exhibitor

All Exhibits must be new, and not previously entered at a show.

If an Exhibitors name is showing on an item it must be taped over

Quilts and wall hangings **must** have the size written on entry form and a sleeve attached for hanging.

A quilt is a textile piece which consists of 3 layers, which are held together by being stitched.

All Exhibits must be new, and not previously entered at a show.

If an Exhibitors name is showing on an item it must be taped over

Pottery and Ceramics must be cleaned and decorated by the exhibitor, but firing may be done by someone else.

Jewellery articles are to be mounted for display on white, or black card (or a bust)

Mosaic to be no larger than 90x90cm

All manual arts entries size must be indicated on the entry form

Cards are not to be larger than A5 (15x21cm)

Not kits are permitted in any sections.

Direct copies of photographs, images, or art work from magazines, books, websites, or tutorials will not be accepted.

**No kits please**, you can use parts from a kit, but your entry should be based on your imagination. Kit projects will not be judged.

Only pre-schoolers may have help with projects

All root vegetables are to be washed and have some top remaining and all bunches are to be tied

All citrus fruits are to have stalks left on and leaves are permitted

Eggs are to be submitted on a white disposable plate (paper)

All entries in vegetables and fruit must be submitted either on a white disposable plate, or in a recyclable glass jar

Please write name on the BOTTOM of the plate (or on a white label on the BOTTOM of the jar).

### Entry requirements

Entries must be grown by the Entrant

All pots to be clean and free of slugs, snails and other insects.

Names and category to be written on a label affixed to the BOTTOM of the pot or vase.

Vases need to have enough water to last 24 hours.

Pot and vase size is limited to 30 cm in diameter, except for miniature gardens and novelty planters.

Specimens should have the end of the stem wrapped in damp paper towel, and then covered in alfoil.

## ***Subsection J Farm Produce***

### Entry requirements

Entries must be grown by the Entrant

All grains should be in a durable bucket with the entrants name labelled on the BOTTOM of the bucket.

Category numbers should be clearly written on the buckets

Buckets should have no identifying logos

- 175. Barley, any variety, 2kg from 2024 crop, in a durable bucket

### **Class- WOOL**

The maximum growth of wool for all fleeces shall be 366 days. The number of day's growth of wool shall be stated on entry form. Fleeces from Pet Sheep are prohibited. The Judges shall have the power to transfer to its proper class any exhibit, which has been wrongly entered. Exhibitors are to place a card on their exhibits describing it. All fleeces must be skirted. Wool will be judged on a scale of points laid down by the Royal Agricultural Society.
